Anatomy of a Coffee Bean. The heart of the bean lies deep within three layers of covering. On the outer most side, we have what is called the 'mesocarp' or otherwise known as the pulp of the cherry. Depending on the plant's variety, it can be vary in color from a deep red or yellow depending on ripeness.

With that long-winded intro over, let's get into the actual Anatomy of a Coffee Bean! The Parts of a Coffee Bean: Parchment or Endocarp . This is a thick shell-like layer that surrounds the bean and is made up of 3-7 layers. Mucilage (pulp) or Mesocarp. This is the "flesh" of the coffee fruit- during cherry maturation.
